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FOREWORD

Embracing the Gifted Child's Curiosity

Ryan stares at the crack at the foot of the classroom window, quietly absorbed in the mystery of where the ants disappear when the earth opens just enough to let them in. For the past six months, he has developed a deep interest in ants. His second-grade worksheet waits untouched, not because he refuses to learn, but because he has already answered similar questions many times before. The lesson asks him to repeat what he knows; the world invites him to wonder about what he does not yet understand.

Research shows that gifted children often pursue learning through open-ended questioning, seeking complexity, novelty, and connection¹. While his teacher guides the class toward specific answers, Ryan is drawn to living questions: How many kinds of ants live nearby and around the world? Do they all work the same way? How do they communicate? How do different food sources impact the colony?

His curiosity stretches further: What else might be out there in the universe? How do the things he's learning in class matter beyond the page? How do they connect to the world he touches, sees, and inhabits? To him, learning is not a task to complete, it is a journey to follow. His curiosity pulls him beyond the printed, the planned, and the predictable, inviting him to explore places where knowledge is still unfolding.

This is not an imaginary child. This is my son, gifted, deeply curious, and often captivated by questions that do not align with the lessons schools expect him to prioritize based on his chronological age. His approach to learning does not reject knowledge; rather, it seeks meaning and connection to the world he inhabits. A child like this may not "perform" to his perceived potential in traditional educational settings. His curiosity may be misunderstood, and he may be labeled as a "problem," "willful," or "disruptive" child. Yet what appears to be resistance is often a deep desire to engage meaningfully with ideas that matter.

Ironically, traits such as curiosity and inquisitiveness, often undervalued or penalized in school, are highly prized in the workplace. Research underscores their importance: curiosity has been shown to drive adaptability and innovation², is recognized as a core leadership skill in high-performing organizations³, and is frequently cited by successful leaders as the most important trait for navigating complexity and uncertainty.⁴

Now, imagine adding a disability whether physical, learning, or developmental to that profile. The misunderstandings and negative labels may compound, even when teachers, counselors, friends, and peers are well-intentioned. In education, children who are gifted with a disability are referred to as “twice-exceptional” (2e); in broader circles, the term “neurodivergent” is more commonly used.

Research increasingly underscores the vital role of non-cognitive capacities in shaping life satisfaction, mental health, and long-term well-being. These capacities including self-enhancement, openness to change, interpersonal and social-emotional skills, self-regulation, and resilience, are strongly linked to both academic persistence and workplace performance⁵.

Entrepreneurship: A Creative, Safe Outlet for Gifted Minds

Chris’s book offers families a different starting point. It invites parents to look beyond confusing labels and instead invest energy into strengthening the parent–child relationship. This relational foundation creates safe, meaningful growth experiences for both parent and child, experiences grounded in the wider world, rich with questions worth following.

It aligns with research suggesting that gifted children thrive when their curiosity is nurtured through authenticity, autonomy, complexity, and support⁶. When parents co-create learning experiences with their children, they move from managing academic output to cultivating a lifelong capacity for exploration, agency, and resilience.





Acknowledgments

Gifted thinkers often have big ideas, strong feelings, and deep questions. This space is for both of you to be heard. No rushing. No pressure. Just real conversation.


Take turns answering the questions below. Be honest, thoughtful, and open. There are no wrong answers.


This is not about copying someone else’s idea. It’s about exploring what you value most.
